

## Telfair Cape

## The Goods:

Teedles: US 10.5 cable needles, 24–32 in. length

Yarn: Lion Brand Martha Stewart Merino Yarn, (100 % Merino Wool, 120 yds/50 g) 4 skeins Peacock (MC), 4 skeins Igloo (CC)

 $\bigcirc$  auge: 13 sts by 21 rows in  $4 \times 4$  in.

Finished measurements: 10 in. across the neck (20 in. around), 20.5 in. across bottom (41 in. around) in Small (Medium, Large)

Notions: 5 stitch markers, tapestry needle

Notes: SIM: Slip Marker, M: Marker, st: Stitch, Kf&B: Knit into the front and back of stitch



\*\*You will be holding 2 strands througut the whole project\*\*

Using MC, cast on 60 sts and join for working in the round, placing markers at beginning of round, 13 sts, 16 sts, 43 sts, 46 sts (5 markers in all)

Row 2, \*knit to 1 st before M, Kf&B, SIM; repeat from \* to end of round (do not increase at beginning of round marker) {64 sts)

Row 3: knit

Row 4: Repeat Row 2

Row 5-8: switch to CC and repeat Row 3 & 2 twice

Continue in this pattern until 4 (5, 6) stripes are complete and remove 2nd and 4th markers {92 sts, 96, 100}

Row 17: Knit in MC

Row 18: \*Knit to M, slip 4 sts knitwise; repeat from \* to end of round

Row 19: repeat Row 17

Row 20: repeat Row 18

Row 21: Knit in CC

Row 22: \*Knit to 1 st before M, Kf&b, SlM, k3, Kf&b; repeat from \* to end of round (do not increase at beginning of round marker)

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Row 23: repeat Row 21

Row 24: \*K to M, slip 4 sts knitwise; repeat from \* to end of round

Continue repeat Rows 17-24 until 12 (12, 14) stripes total are complete {108, 112, 120 sts}

Lace Edging:

Change to MC, knit 1 row

Row 2: \*k2tog 3 (4, 5) times, [yo, k1] 6, 7, 8 times, k2 tog 3 (4, 5) times; repeat from \* to end

Row 3: knit

Row 4: purl

Repeat Row 1-4, 4 times

Loosely cast off

Neck Lace Collar:

Pick up 60 sts around neckline with CC, join to work in the round

Row 1: knit

Row 2: \*k2tog (twice), [yo, k1] 4 times, k2tog (twice); repeat from \* to end

Row 3: knit

Row 4: Purl

Repeat Row 1-4 one more time

Loosely cast off purlwise (this build a stronger edge to

help the collar stand up and not roll)

Wet block to size & weave in ends
